- usually

- six times in a year

Positive Form

I
You
We + play chess every week.
They

He
She + plays chess every week.
It

Example: I play soccer every weekend.
She gets up very early.

Negative Form

I
You do not play chess
We + don't
They

He does not play chess
She + doesn't
It

Example: I don't listen pop music.
She doesn't watch TV every day.

Question Form

Do + you play chess every day ?
we
they

Does + he play chess every day ?
she
it

Short&Long Answer

Yes, I do. / Yes I play chess.

No, I don't / No, I don't play chess.

Example: A: Do they play basketball every Sunday?
B: Yes, they do. / No, they don't.

A: Does Jack go to concerts every month?
B: Yes, he does. / No, he doesn't.

2. love

- I love chocolate cake.
- He loves reading a book.
- We love playing soccer.

3. enjoy

- You enjoy listening to music
- She enjoys watching comedy movies.
- They enjoy taking photos.



4. be fond of

- I am fond of camping.
- She is fond of playing an instrument.
- We are fond of following the fashion.

5. be crazy about

- I am crazy about basketball.
- He is crazy about cycling.
- They are crazy about eating pizza.

6. be keen on

- I am keen on playing baseball.
- She is keen on drinking coffee.
- You are keen on singing.

7. be interested in

Prefer: tercih etmek

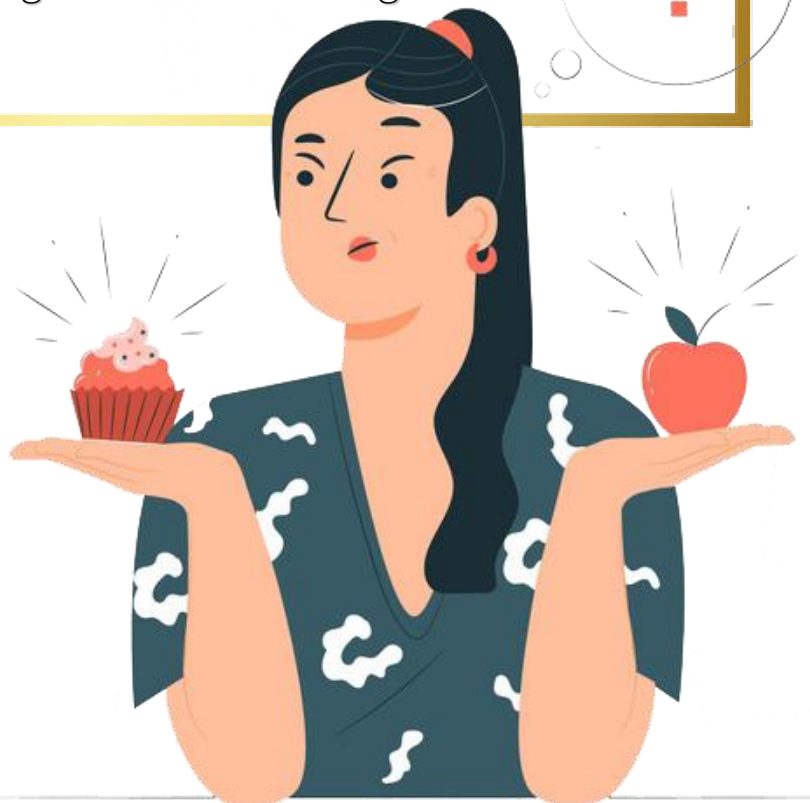
1. Subject + prefer + noun to noun

2. Subject + prefer + Verb(ing) + to + Verb(ing)

- I prefer drinking tea to drinking coffee.
- My brother prefers swimming to cycling.
- We prefer reading a book to watching TV.
